The Principles of Prayer

Prayer gives us a language for relating directly to God. We were made in God's image, created to be in intimate connection with Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Prayer is meant to be public and private. Jesus teaches his disciples to pray privately, and he also teaches and demonstrates public prayer. All Christians need to be comfortable praying publicly because it is one of the primary ways we share Christ. For Jesus, fasting and prayer are inextricably connected.

The Posture of Prayer
