We love to tell kids that prayer is just a conversation with God. One definition defines prayer as “talking to God and listening to Him.” This definition evokes a conversational attitude where two people are talking and listening to each other.

Our communication with God is not just important in the quiet times we spend with Him, but we should be the outward example of that communication as we lead children to discover how to talk to and listen to God. We believe as children discover a closer relationship with God through prayer, they will grow deeper in their faith and understanding of Him!

THE LORD'S PRAYER



The Lord's Prayer is a familiar prayer in Christianity. This prayer is found in two locations in scripture: Matthew 6:9-13 and Luke 11:2-4. The Matthew version is the one that most closely resembles the version prayed in churches. The prayer resembles a traditional Jewish prayer in structure and language: acknowledging God's character, praising, petitioning, and expressing desire for the kingdom of God. We pray this prayer collectively and individually.

**Our Father who art in heaven,

Thy kingdom come.

**Give us this day our daily bread,
and forgive us our trespasses,
as we forgive those who trespass against us,


Jesus Teaches Us How To Pray

In these verses, Jesus teaches us how to pray. When we pray, we talk to God. We don't pray to make other people think that we are good.

Instead, we pray because we love to talk to God!

An Amazing Promise!

Read John 14:13-14

God does not always answer our prayers with a "yes". Sometimes He answers with a "later" and sometimes He answers with a "no". But, Jesus promises us that there are some prayers that will always get a "Yes" - when we pray "in Jesus name." These are "promise prayers". Praying "in Jesus' name" means that we believe in Jesus as our Savior and we are asking for something that the Bible tells us to pray for. Read the verses below, then read the promise prayers. These are prayers that you can pray today!

Read John 14:15

Dear God, please help me to love You and keep Your commandments.



Read John 15:8

Dear God, please help me to be Your disciple.



Read John 15:12

Dear God, please help me to love other people!



Praying in Jesus' Name

Read 2 Thessalonians 1:11-12



Ask God to help you do the good things that He has called you to do so that Jesus will be praised.

What Should I Pray About?

Read Philippians 4:4-7

God tells us that we shouldn't be anxious or worried about anything, but that we should pray about EVERYTHING! He doesn't promise that He will always answer "yes" to everything we ask Him for, but He still wants us to talk to Him about everything that we are feeling, thinking, and needing. God does promise that, when we bring our requests to Him, He will give us peace. Circle all of the things that are true below.



When God Answers "No"

Paul had an illness or problem that he called his "thorn in the flesh". He asked God to take it away three different times, but God said "no". In the end, Paul realized that God's "no" was what was best for Paul.

Read 2 Corinthians 12:7-10

We may not always understand why God says "no" to our prayers. But, we can trust that God loves us and that His "no" is what is best for us, even if we can't see the reason or understand it.

A Simple Way to Pray

Jesus' disciples asked Jesus to teach them how to pray. He gave them an example prayer to follow. We call this "The Lord's Prayer".

Read Matthew 6:9-13

In this prayer Jesus teaches us to praise or worship God, confess our sins, and ask God for what we need. We can also see, from other Bible verses, that we should be praying thankful prayers, too. There are four kinds of prayers that we can and should be praying:

Praising Prayers



Dear God, You are so amazing! You made the heavens and the earth!




Confessing Prayers

Dear God, I sinned by disobeying You. I am sorry. Please help me to obey You.



Thanking Prayers



Dear God, thank you for giving me food to eat, a good home, and a family!

Asking Prayers

Dear God, please help me to love You and serve You with all my heart!


Paul's Asking Prayer

Paul prayed for people in a church. He asked that Jesus Christ would live in their hearts through faith and that these people would understand how BIG God's love was for them.

Read Ephesians 3:14-19

God's love is so BIG that we can never fully understand it! But, Paul prayed that the people would understand and know God's love better. You can pray this prayer, too! Paul's Prayer of Praise





Paul told the Philippians that he knew that God had started working in their hearts and that God would finish His good work - making the people more and more like Jesus Christ.

When we confess our sins, we pray to God and admit that God is right and we are wrong. In confession, we stop trying to hide from God and instead we agree with God about our sins. We tell God that we are sorry for sinning against Him and disobeying Him. In confession, we ask God to give us the strength to turn away from our sin.

When we confess our sins, God promises to forgive us!

Prayer that Led to Lions

Read Daniel 6:10-11

Daniel kept right on praying. The evil men told the king and Daniel was thrown into the lion's den.

Read Daniel 6:16-23

We are going to start learning a prayer of confession. "Iniquity" is a big word, but it means sin or disobeying God. In this verse, King David is asking God to wash away the sin in his heart and to forgive him for disobeying God. Try saying this part of the verse five times, one time for each finger.

Wash away all my iniquity... Psalm 51:2



Daniel's Prayer of Confession

Some time after Daniel had been thrown in the lion's den, he prayed a prayer of confession for himself and his people.

Read Daniel 9:3-5

When we confess our sins, we come before God and admit that God is right and we are wrong. We stop trying to hide our sins from God and instead agree with God about our sins. We tell God that we are sorry for sinning against Him and disobeying Him. We ask God to give us the strength to turn away from our sin.

Daniel confessed his sins and the sins of his people. He admitted that God is right and that he and his people had been wrong.

Read Daniel 9:13-14

Daniel confessed that he and his people had sinned in four ways:



- 1 They did not pray to God and seek His favor. Instead, they ignored God.
- 2 They did not turn away from their sins.
- 3 They didn't pay attention to and love God's truth.
- 4 They didn't obey God.

Have you ever sinned in these ways? If so, pray and confess your sins to God today. Ask God to help you **seek Him** with your whole heart, **turn away from your sins**, **love His truth**, and **obey His voice**.

Color the card below and cut it out. Then, put it in your Bible to mark Psalm 121 OR put it next to your bed to help you remember that God is always with you, even at night!







A King in Trouble


Hezekiah was a King who feared God. After he had been king for 14 years, a bad king from a different land came up to fight against him.







What If I Don't Know How to Pray?

Are you ready to learn a really big word?
Here we go: The new word is "Intercede." Can you say that?
To intercede means to go in between two people and help
them come together.



Did you know that, if you have put your faith in Jesus Christ as your Savior, the Holy Spirit now lives in your heart? You can't see Him, but He is there. The Holy Spirit helps you to understand God's Word and He helps you to know when you have sinned. The Holy Spirit also "intercedes" for you when you don't know how to pray. He goes between you and God, helping you to pray.

Sometimes our hearts get heavy and sad. Sometimes we get frustrated and confused. We want to pray, but we don't know how. In those times, the Holy Spirit intercedes or goes between us and God, praying for us in exactly the right way! Listen to the verse below. When you hear the word "intercedes", raise your hand. Listen closely!
